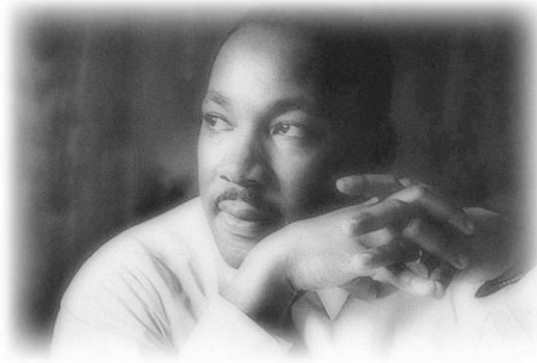

2018 MLK Dream Keeper Award

The Dream Keeper Award was established by former Councilman E.W. Cromartie, II. The award recognizes exemplary displays of committed service to the tenets of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The ideals of social responsibility, political empowerment, diversity, racial harmony, nonviolence, and unselfish service must be demonstrated voluntarily by the nominee in support of his or her community and fellow citizens.

Nomination Criteria

1. Demonstrated public service

The nominee must have provided extraordinary assistance to a resident or agency within their community. Through documented work with volunteer work programs, charitable service, and/or leadership roles in the community, the nomination letter should include details of the nominee's service.

2. Nominee's effectiveness

An evaluation of the nominee's effectiveness shall be judged by his or her impact on individuals, groups, or organizations served. The nominee must have demonstrated a constant drive and aspiration to provide support to others in the community for at least 12 months.

3. Documentation

Nominations must include comprehensive documentation of the candidate's public service contribution. The **nomination should include a statement of 150 words or less** explaining the nominee's community service activities.

4. Requirements

The nominee **must** be age 18 or younger and enrolled in school with a minimum 2.0 grade point average. Nominees **must** attend the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Celebration on Monday, January 15, 2018 at 4 p.m. at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Park and Community Center, 2300 Greene Street. Winners will be announced at the ceremony.

Nominations must be postmarked by Friday, December 15, 2017, in order to be eligible. Nominations can be mailed to:

The award recipients will be selected by an impartial host of judges. Scholarship winners will not be selected by City of Columbia staff nor the Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Foundation Planning Committee.

2018 MLK Dream Keeper Scholarship Checklist

Please review the following checklist to make sure that your application is complete.

The following items must be included in the application packet:

- The nomination form from page 3 of this application. Please **print** required information.
- A **statement of 150 words or less** explaining the candidate's volunteer service, most outstanding achievement, and contributions made to his or her community.
- Documentation of public service to include certificates, volunteer log, letter from organization documenting service, etc. Please list all memberships in community organizations, honors and awards.
- A transcript from your school or report card.
- Letter of recommendation. The person nominating the candidate must explain why this candidate should receive the Dream Keeper Scholarship Award.
- A short essay (**250 words**) describing how you have attempted to emulate or mirror the ideals and philosophies of Dr. Martin Luther King into your life.
