





Violence Policy Center Again Ranks South Carolina #1 in Rate of Women Murdered by Men

The City of Columbia will host the 9th Annual Walk against Domestic Violence on Saturday, October 10, 2015 at Finlay Park at 9 a.m., located at 930 Laurel St.


Today, the Violence Policy Center again ranked South Carolina first in the nation for the rate of women murdered by men, with a rate of 2.32 per 100,000, according to the new Violence Policy Center (VPC) report "When Men Murder Women: An Analysis of 2013 Homicide Data". This is the 18th year in a row that South Carolina has ranked in the top 10 states for the rate of women murdered by men and the fourth year in which our state has been identified as having the highest lethality rate by this count.

The Mayor's walk supports the advocates, admires the survivors, honors the taken and never gives up hope in stopping the violence. Domestic violence has become a critical issue in the Palmetto State.

"This is an open call to the community to join us on October 10 and help the City of Columbia to take steps against domestic violence. As the top ranking state in the nation, we must work together to decrease the number of domestic violence incidents and increase awareness about resources and help for those who need assistance," Councilwoman Tameika Isaac Devine stated. Devine serves as chairperson of the City of Columbia's Domestic Violence Task Force.




