<p>Preanesthetic exam performed. Temperature recorded as normothermic 99-102 per records. Pulse, respirations in normal range per records. Cardiovascular, pulmonary, EENT, integument, neuro, musculoskeletal, PLN NSF.</p> <p>Premedicated with 0.05 mg/kg acepromazine, 0.02 mg/kg buprenorphine IM. Induction 5 mg/kg ketamine and 0.25 mg/kg diazepam IV. Intubated and maintained on Iso/O2. Patient placed in dorsal recumbency and surgical site prepared. Fur clipped then area scrubbed with alternating isopropyl alcohol/chlorhexidine 4% scrub. Lidocaine testicular block. Meloxicam 0.1 mg/kg sq. Patient transferred to surgical suite and additional scrub performed. Warm water circulating pad utilized. Patient placed in dorsal recumbency. Sterile drape and pack used. Scrotal neuter performed. Small incision over median raphe followed by exteriorization of each testicle. Each cord double clamped then Miller's knot with 2-0 absorbable monofilament placed twice on cord. Scrotal sq closed with single cruciate 2-0 absorbable monofilament. Surgical skin glue over apposed skin. Tattoo placed. Recover on warming pad. Post-op temperature normothermic 99-102 per records. Extubated when appropriate – patient has strong palpebral and able to swallow. Patient remains in recovery until fully mobile then transferred to recovery bank nearby. Patient remains in recovery bank entire day for monitoring.</p>
